<b>6</b>	<b>POLICE REPORT</b>		The Police are very aware of people in the area who are not local and are breaking covid regulations. They are speaking to those people.	
<b>7</b>	<b>GEPARK</b>	7.1	Funding is going to be applied for from the National Lottery Heritage fund for several projects. One is 'Slow	

		<p>Tourism’, designed to slow people down and ‘Engagement’, and Marine Tourism, and engagement utilising the harbour and Marina. The next round of funding would be to facilitate projects in this part of the Geopark, including a heritage project about the use of the Gaelic language in this area, and document heritage that may be at risk of being lost.</p> <p>7.2 The Rock Stop has been given £8000 award from the ‘Visit Scotland Grant Scheme’ for visitor attractions affected by Covid. This could pay for outside benches and Gazebo type structures so that visitors can sit outside only or takeaway. The exhibition would be open.</p> <p>7.3 The Ambassador Scheme has been launched which brings together businesses in the Geopark area to promote their business, and they, in turn, promote the Geopark.</p>	
<b>8</b>	<b>LAURA’S REPORT</b>	<p>Criech Locality Group have announced the development of the County of Sutherland’s Community Resilience Plan, bringing the Community together to identify assets and decide what can be done in a variety of emergency situations. There is a Locality Group Facebook page open to anyone who lives in KLB. It is hoped that members of the Community will join the group to get connected. The Locality Group has set up a tourism sub-group for which the website is being developed. Local businesses are being asked whether they would like to be listed on the site and whether they would contribute to help with the operating costs of the website. The next Locality Group meeting is 22<sup>nd</sup> April, and all are welcome.</p> <p>The Sutherland Community Partnership meets on the 7<sup>th</sup> May. All are welcome.</p>	
<b>9</b>	<b>SIGNAGE</b>	<p>Money from the Ward Discretionary fund (£1800) will pay for the signs. It was decided by the all the Council members to order the signs from the same designer as the John Muir Trust, as signs made by Douglas Gibson (North Highland Initiative) would not contain all the required information.</p> <p>Richard and Gerald Osborne (Rhiconich Estate) are designing a sign for Oldshoremore Beach, similar to the one at Polin, with a budget of about £500.</p>	
<b>10</b>	<b>CORRESPONDENCE</b>	<p>Emails from Douglas Gibson (North Highland Initiative) were received which indicated that there would be a</p>	

			limit to the information that could be included on the proposed signs.	
<b>11</b>	<b>AOCB</b>	<p><b>8.1</b> The Food Bank has received funding and will be continuing. The Community Garden has applied for funding to pay for a full-time gardener who would develop the Community Garden to help supplement the Church Store House.</p> <p><b>8.2</b> There is concern that there is too much duplication of information on the 5 or 6 leaflets that are being developed for the different local areas. The Council was asked whether they thought it would be better to combine all the information on one leaflet, greatly reducing the cost. The Council members agreed that this would be a good idea. This could be discussed with the other area Chairs.</p> <p><b>8.3</b> Hugh suggested that KLB would greatly benefit from a NW Sutherland Development Officer. There is a lot of funding available, but it needs to be applied for. KLB along with Durness need to employ someone to apply for funding (Like Helen Houston in Scourie). Andrea will contact Helen for advice.</p> <p><b>8.4</b> The Coastal Communities Fund will be sorted out on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> April, though it was heavily over-subscribed.</p>	<p>Kirsty</p> <p>Andrea to contact Helen in Scourie.</p>
